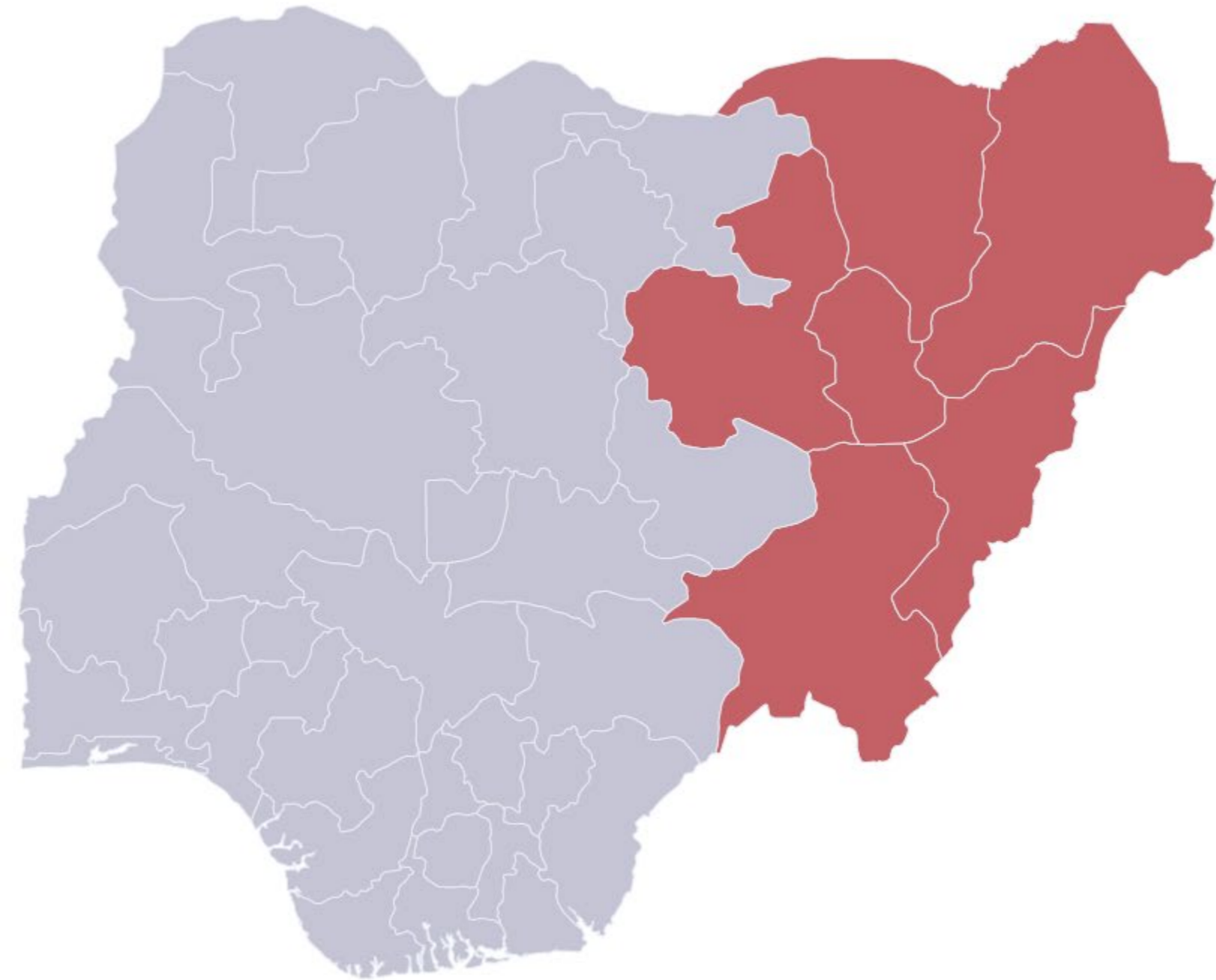

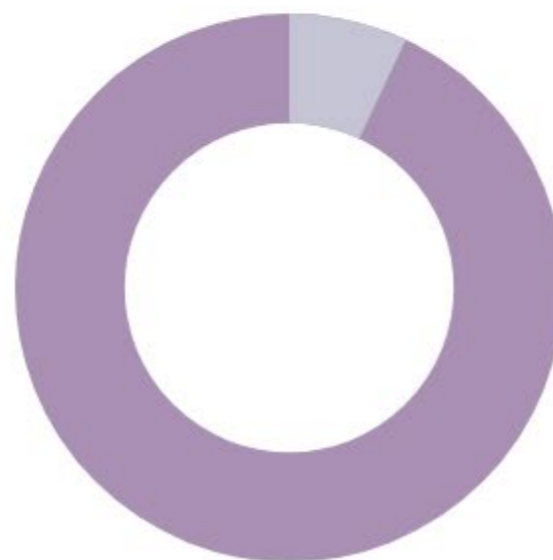

Since 2009, more than 37,000 have been killed by Boko Haram, most of them from the six states in the North Eastern part of Nigeria

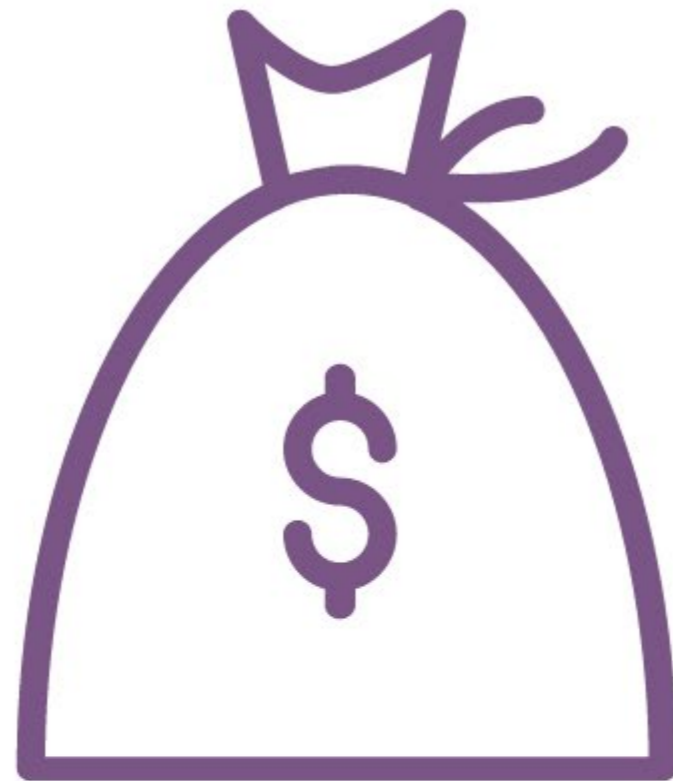


2.7 MILLION
